What is New Albion Wednesday School?

New Albion Wednesday School offers core liberal arts courses as well as enrichment classes that meet the scheduling needs of homeschooling families.

Why choose New Albion Wednesday School?

(1) New Albion Wednesday School offers a quiet, reflective, intimate learning environment. (2) Class sizes are limited to ten students (excluding Junior Classical League).

Where do classes meet?

New Albion Wednesday School meets at Trinity Orthodox Presbyterian Church at 23211 Meridian Avenue South, Bothell, WA 98021.

Are these classes year-long classes?

Unless otherwise noted, all classes meet weekly (excluding holidays) from early September to the end of May (exact start and end dates to be announced).

May parents attend with their children?

Yes. Parents are welcome and encouraged to attend. Doing so often enhances student learning since parents can give guidance to their students throughout the week.

Is there homework?

Yes. Our academic classes include complete curricula. Therefore, we expect students to complete work at home every day of the school-week. You won't need a separate curriculum.

COURSE CATALOG

Beginning Latin (Grades 4-6)

Contact teacher for time

Teacher: Jan Anderson

Prerequisites: None

Description: The introductory Latin class is offered to beginning Latin students or students with minimal Latin grammar studies in grades 4 through 6. No prior knowledge of Latin is required. The students, while in class only one day a week, should be prepared to study some Latin every school day. The class centers on acquiring a beginning Latin vocabulary, gaining a general knowledge of the inflected structure of the Latin language, being able to use simple verbs in three tenses, learning simple jobs of nouns in sentences and how these jobs are indicated in Latin, and using some simple adjectives to modify nouns. There is a weekly vocabulary quiz along with some worksheets covering the grammar that was explained in class. Simple Latin conversation is introduced as are Latin sayings that are still part of our vernacular.

Tuition: \$50.00 per month

Drama and Drawing (Grades 3 and up)

10:25 AM - 11:45 AM

Teacher: Mark Callender (drama), Ruth Callender (drawing)

Prerequisites: None

Description: These two classes are for two ages groups. While the younger are taking drama the older will be engaged in drawing class. This arrangement will last for half the year after which the older and younger students will switch subjects for the rest of the year.

School Choir (Grades 3 and up)

12:30 PM – 1:45 PM

Teacher: Andrew Jensen

Prerequisites: Teacher approval with voice hearing.

Description: Students will sing vocal literature from a variety of eras with a special emphasis on Latin material including Psalm chants, Gregorian hymns, Renaissance music, and Baroque pieces. English music from the 16th through the 20th centuries may also be included. Basic singing skills will be covered, such as posture, vocal production, and aural accuracy. Basic music reading skills will be taught, including the ability to read diatonic music in modern notation as well as Gregorian Psalm tones in basic chant notation.

Tuition: \$20 per month

Fee: One-time, \$35 music fee

Junior Classical League (Grades 3 and up)

1:45 PM – 3:15 PM

Teacher: Jan Anderson

Prerequisites: Students should have completed first year Latin. Permission of teacher is required.

Description: The National Junior Classical League is an organization of school students sponsored by the American Classical League, the largest Classical organization in the world today. Its purpose is to encourage an interest in and an appreciation of the language, literature, and culture of ancient Greece and Rome and to impart an understanding of the debt of our own culture to that of Classical antiquity. Students compete in academic and creative arenas with students of similar ages, abilities and interests, hear world class speakers at the annual national convention, and make friends with others students of the classics from all around the country. Seven separate scholarships are offered to Junior Classical League members each academic year.

Tuition: Free with teacher approval

Fee: \$15 per month for supplies and materials

Beginning Literature (Early to mid elementary readers)

1:45 PM – 3:15 PM

Teacher: Lisa LaMarche

Prerequisites: Ability to read

Description: This class is designed to teach the beginnings of literary analysis, which includes such elements as plot and conflict, setting, character and theme. The class will also include poetry analysis, memorization and recitation. The students will also have opportunity for reading out loud and learning proper reading techniques such as elocution and presentation. Most of all, I hope to instill in the children a love for reading, the ability to intelligently consider what they read and the joy of experiencing great works of fiction together.

Tuition: \$25 per family per month

Fee: one time \$15 fee to cover supplies
